Independent Auditor's Report

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

OPINION:

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **CENTRE FOR EDUCATION, DEVELOPMENT ACTION AND RESEARCH (CEDAR), " Thy Grace ", 23, Old Natham Road, Madurai - 625 014.** which comprise the Balance Sheet as at **March 31, 2022**, the Statement of Income and Expenditure (including Other Comprehensive Income), for the year ended on that date, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "The financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Accounting Principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs (Financial position) of the Association as at March 31, 2022, the excess of expenditure over income (Financial performance and total comprehensive income), for the year ended on that date.

BASIS FOR OPINION

INFORMATION OTHER THAN THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND AUDITOR'S REPORT THEREON

The Association's Board of Members is responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information of board of directors report but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report there.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit, or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.
